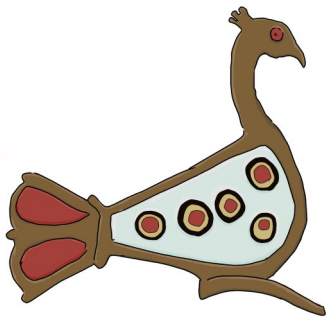
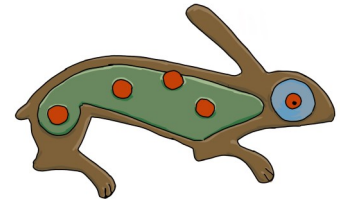
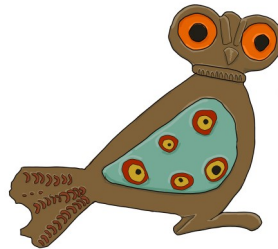
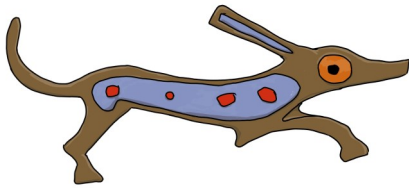
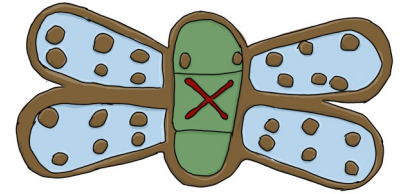
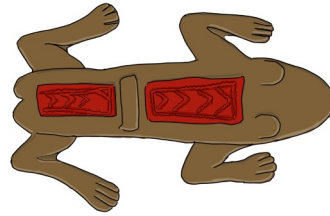
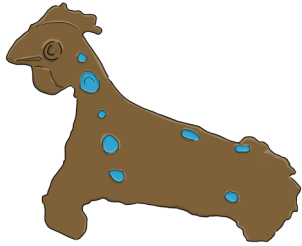


# Make a replica Romano-British zoomorphic brooch

In June 2021, a bronze chicken brooch was excavated at Vindolanda. Lots of zoomorphic (animal shaped) brooches from the Roman period have been found in Britain, many of them with bright coloured enamel inlay. These drawings are based on brooches excavated in Britain.



I've made a Minimus version (of course). Here's how to make your own brooch! You'll need a piece of card and a piece of tinfoil to start with. Draw a brooch shape on the card using the templates on the next page. Lay the template on the tinfoil and draw over the lines with a pencil or biro, so the lines are transferred. Cut out the foil shape, with a margin of about a centimetre round the edge. Cut the card shape out and glue the foil on top. Fold the margin over the edge of the card shape and glue it. Use sharpies to colour your brooch. Stick a safety pin to the back with tape.
