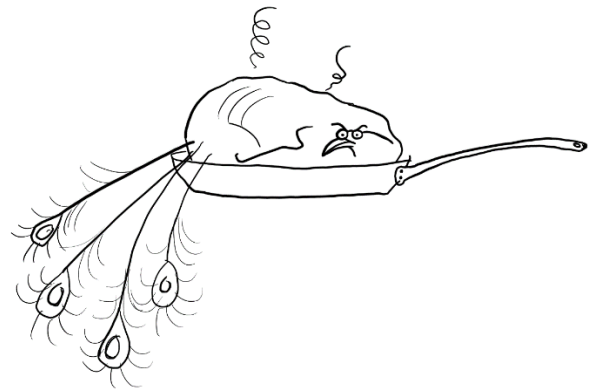
In the following sentences

Latin

In Latin, nouns change their ending to show who is the subject and who is the object.

servus cenam parat

The slave prepares dinner.

The slave is the subject, so the ending on **servus** stays the same. The dinner has become the object, so in Latin it is now **cenam**.
